Who is WIC for?

WIC is a free program for

- Pregnant women
- Breastfeeding moms until infant turns 1 year old
- New moms until infant turns 6 months old
- Infants and children up to age 5

A foster parent or any caregiver can sign a child up for WIC.

To get WIC, you must live in NY State AND meet the income guidelines below.

If you receive Medicaid, SNAP or TANF you automatically qualify.
